



**Prof. Dr. [Tuna Taşan-Kok](#)** holds the Chair of Urban Planning and Governance at the University of Amsterdam (UvA), Faculty of Social Sciences, Department of Human Geography, Planning and International Development Studies. She also holds an honorary professorship at UCL Bartlett School of Planning, and she is the founder and chair of [UGoveRN](#) (Urban Governance Research Network). Prof. Dr. Tuna Taşan-Kok specialises in dynamic landscapes of urban governance in an increasingly property-led and entrepreneurial planning environment, with the aim to explore new avenues in

policy-making, planning, and urban development from a critical perspective. She pays special attention to the changing practice of urban planning and the roles of urban planners within cities and regions globally. Within this framework, Professor Taşan-Kok's most recent work is an edited volume on [From Student to Urban Planner: Young Practitioners' Reflections on Contemporary Ethical Challenges](#) (Routledge, 2018), co-edited by Mark Oranje. She is also co-editor of [Planning Cultures and Histories: The Evolution of Planning Systems and Spatial Development Patterns](#) (Routledge: 2016) and [Resilience Thinking in Urban Planning](#) (Springer: 2012). In addition to several books, she has also widely published [peer-reviewed articles and book chapters](#) in urban studies, planning and geography.

She has initiated, designed, and coordinated [several international and large-scale research projects](#) along with locally initiated and funded projects, attracting funding from a range of sources, including the European Union, NWO (Dutch Scientific Organisation), Open Research Area (ORA), etc. She was the principal investigator of [PARCOUR](#) (*Public Accountability to Residents in Contractual Urban Redevelopment*) (NWO, ESRC, FAPESP; completed in 2018); and co-principal investigator of [DIVERCITIES](#) (*Governing Urban Diversity, Creating Social Cohesion, Social Mobility and Economic Performance in Today's Hyper-diversified Cities*) (FP7; completed in 2017). Currently, she is co-principal investigator in an ORA funded research project called [WHIG](#) (*What is Governed in Cities: Residential Investment Landscapes and the Governance and Regulation of Housing Production*), which studies the complex governance dynamics in Amsterdam, London, and Paris, and how these complex dynamics relate to the challenges within housing production. She sits on the editorial boards of *Journal of European Urban and Regional Planning*; *Cities*; and *Journal of Planning Literature*. She is a trustee at the [IJURR Foundation](#), which aims to promote and improve social scientific research, education and scholarship in the field of urban, rural and regional studies. She is a member of AESOP (Association of European Schools of Planning), where she Chairs AESOP Best Congress Paper Award. She is also a member of the American Association of Geographers. She earned her PhD in Social Geography from Utrecht University (The Netherlands), Master's degree from the Middle East Technical University (Turkey) in Regional Planning, and Bachelor's degree from Dokuz Eylul University (Turkey).

Professor Taşan-Kok leads [courses](#) in urban planning and urban studies at the University of Amsterdam, Department of Geography, Planning and International Development Studies in the Bachelor degree program of Urban Planning, Master degree program of Urban and Regional Planning, and Urban Research Master Program. She has delivered numerous [key-note talks and lectures](#), represented scientific missions of NWO in The Netherlands and abroad, and provided expert views to several local and international organisations, including Belgian representation to European Commission for Multi-Level Governance Strategy (Ministry of Big Cities Policy, POD). Before joining University of Amsterdam, she worked at several international academic organisations and research institutes, including TUDelft (The Netherlands) and KULeuven (Belgium).
